Doggone Good Readers Q&A

Who would benefit from a therapy dog reading session?

Children who feel uncomfortable reading aloud or need more time to practice their reading skills would be a good fit for these sessions. Studies show that children who practice reading aloud to nonjudgmental listeners, such as dogs, become more confident in their reading skills.

May parents sit in on the sessions?

While family members may greet the dogs after each reading session ends, registered children will attend each program on their own. Exceptions may be made with permission from library staff. Parents are asked to wait in the library and pick up their children at the meeting room door at the end of the program.

Should children bring their own books?

They can, if they like. We will also have a selection of library books to choose from.

Where do the dogs come from?

Our specially trained dogs are registered with Alliance of Therapy Dogs, Therapy Dogs International, and other organizations. They are called “therapy dogs” because they are used to bring joy to people in nursing homes, schools, and other settings. Therapy dogs are patient, gentle, and people-loving.
