When a new little cat joins the family, the big cat must show it the ways of the world. A 2018 Caldecott Honor book.

A Bike Like Sergio's—Maribeth Boelts

Ruben wants a new bike, but when he finds a one-hundred dollar bill, he's not sure of the right thing to do with it.

Blue Sky, White Stars—Sarvinder Naberhaus

A beautiful celebration of America's symbols, history, landscape, and people.

Charlie & Mouse—Laurel Snyder

Young brothers Charlie and Mouse enjoy spending the day together. Winner of the 2018 Geisel Award for beginning readers. Also look for *Charlie & Mouse & Grumpy!*

Crown: An Ode to the Fresh Cut—Derrick Barnes

A celebration of the way a fresh new haircut can make you feel. Winner of a 2018 Caldecott Honor, 2018 Newbery Honor, and 2018 Coretta Scott King Award Honor.

Flashlight Night—Matt Forest Esenwine

Inspired by a treehouse full of books, three kids with only a flashlight brave daring adventures on a summer night.

Jabari Jumps—Gaia Cornwall

Young swimmer Jabari is ready to try jumping off the diving board—or is he?

Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion—Alex T. Smith

In this safari-inspired version of the classic fairy tale, Little Red has some clever new ways to outsmart the Very Hungry Lion.

Love—Matt de la Peña

A tender exploration of the many ways we can see, feel, and experience love.

Maybe Something Beautiful—F. Isabel Campoy

Mira lives in a gray urban neighborhood, until a muralist arrives and inspires color, art, and joy in the community.

Mother Bruce—Ryan T. Higgins

Grumpy bear Bruce is just making breakfast, but when his eggs unexpectedly hatch, the goslings mistake him for their mother. Also look for *Hotel Bruce* and *Bruce's Big Move*.

Niño Wrestles the World—Yuyi Morales

Niño, a young lucha libre champion, can fight off any opponent—but is he ready to face his little sisters when they wake from their nap?

The Not So Quiet Library—Zachariah OHora

Oscar and Theo love to visit their local library on Saturday mornings, but can they save it from a hungry, book-eating monster?

Wolf in the Snow—Matthew Cordell

A girl and a wolf pup are both lost in a blizzard. Will either one find their way home? Winner of the 2018 Caldecott Medal. Also look for *Hello, Hello!* and *Another Brother*.

The Wolf, the Duck, and the Mouse—Mac Barnett

When a mouse is swallowed up by a wolf, he and the duck in its stomach decide that the belly of a wolf might not be such a bad home. Also look for *Extra Yarn* and *Sam and Dave Dig a Hole*.

A humorous introduction to the ugliest fish in the ocean.

Can An Aardvark Bark?—Melissa Stewart

Why do animals make the sounds they do? Find out!

Cricket in the Thicket: Poems About Bugs—Carol Murray

Poetry about various bugs, accompanied by fascinating facts about each one.

Disgusting Critters (series)—Elise Gravel

Introduces readers to a variety of disgusting critters, including head lice, rats, toads, worms, slugs, spiders, and flies. Includes fun graphic illustrations!

A Friend for Lakota—Jim Dutcher and Jaime Dutcher

A young wolf pup fights to survive the dangers of his pack and the environment until he finally finds a friend.

Giant Squid—Candace Fleming

Examines one of the sea's most mysterious and elusive creatures. Winner of a 2017 Sibert Honor for nonfiction.

If Sharks Disappeared—Lily Williams

What would happen if sharks disappeared from our planet?

Malala's Magic Pencil—Malala Yousafzai

How might you help the world if you had a magic pencil? An introduction to the life of education and girls' rights activist Malala Yousafzai.

Spot the Plot—J. Patrick Lewis

A collection of riddle poems inspired by favorite children's books and stories.

When Green Becomes Tomatoes—Julie Fogliano

Poems for various days and seasons throughout the year.
